

McKinney-Vento Liaison Checklist: Supporting College Access



The following checklist is designed to help school districts and liaisons meet their obligations under the federal McKinney-Vento Act, which requires that:

- Liaisons ensure that school personnel working with students who are homeless **receive professional development**;
- School districts ensure that youth who are homeless don't face barriers to accessing academic and **extracurricular activities** and are provided with transportation if needed;
- School districts award full or **partial credit for coursework** satisfactorily completed at a prior school;
- School districts ensure that youths who are homeless **receive college counseling**;
- Liaisons ensure that unaccompanied youth who are homeless are told that they can apply for federal financial aid as independent students and are given **verification of their independent student status for purposes of the FAFSA**; and
- Liaisons ensure that youth are referred to **housing services**.

<p>(16) Help students who are MV eligible apply for an award through the NYS Tuition Assistance Program (TAP): https://www.hesc.ny.gov/pay-for-college/apply-for-financial-aid/nys-tap.html</p> <p>Tips for Unaccompanied Homeless Youth</p> <p>Independent vs. dependent status: Independent students get smaller TAP awards than dependent students (approximately \$2,000 less each year). If an unaccompanied homeless youth can safely get their parents' financial information and signature, they may want to explore applying as a dependent student even though they may qualify as an independent student.</p> <p>Proving independent status: If an unaccompanied homeless youth applies for TAP as an independent student, the youth usually must show that there has been "an involuntary dissolution of their family resulting in relinquishment of their parents' responsibility and control." The template verification letter mentioned above is not enough to prove independent student status for TAP. To show involuntary dissolution, the student should submit a statement from someone like a McKinney-Vento liaison, a social worker, a legal aid representative, caseworker, or member of the clergy relating to the youth's family circumstances. Many students may feel out of place in college and that they don't belong. <p>(20) Connect students who are MV eligible with resources to help with housing at college <u>and</u> during college breaks.</p> <p>Tips Housing deposits: Students who are MV eligible may face barriers to accessing college housing because financial aid is often disbursed after housing deposits are due. Reach out to the college to see if it will waive/reduce/postpone the housing deposit until after the financial aid is disbursed. Gap housing: Many students who are MV eligible need housing over breaks. Many colleges have housing available to international students and/or student athletes over school breaks.
